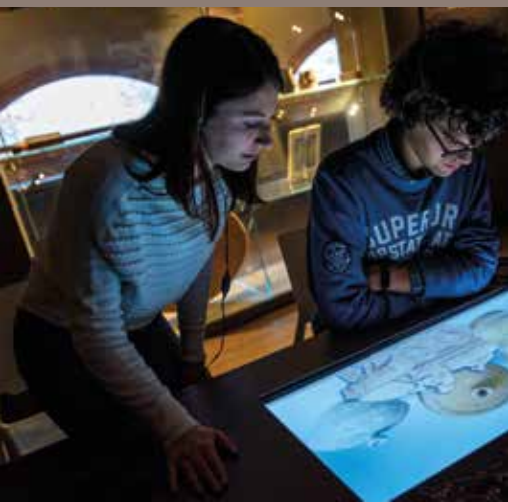




TAM is a new cultural reality set up in a XVI century tower in the center of Cureggio.

It's a place where history, culture and the skills of people who inhabited the surrounding areas between Late Antiquity and the Middle Ages are narrated through modern communication tools: videos, audios, cinematic drone shots, 3D models and reproductions of archaeological finds.

TAM promotes and adds value to the rich albeit less known cultural heritage of a region which has its center in Cureggio's baptismal complex linked to the baptisteries of Novara, Mergozzo, Agrate and Baveno, together with the monuments and archaeological sites of the territory located between the rivers Sesia and Ticino, from Novara to Valsesia and the local lakeshores.



TAM narrates the evolution of the landscapes and daily lives of the ancient peoples of these lands.

Here our story starts with a Neanderthal male discovered at the slopes of Mountain Fenera, moving on to the rich Golasecca merchants from the IX to the VI century AD, to the Gallians arriving from central Europe, and subsequently from the Roman to the Longobard supremacy.



In Casa Torre special attention is given to the sepulture of a noble Longobard warrior found in Cureggio in 2002 next to the Baptistery of San Giovanni. In the rooms of the interactive museum of Cureggio the tour is guided by three characters: a Roman woman called Licinia Iustina, whose existence was indicated by two epigraphs discovered in the village in the past, the deacon Stefano, and a noble and proud Longobard warrior. The tour also provides either a more assisted route recommended to group visits with an average duration of 35 minutes, or an individual consultation where you can freely engage with the interactive stations.

At last the visit can be integrated inside the Baptistery of San Giovanni with the video-art installation 'Water of life', which illustrates the meaning of water for religions and baptism.
